

"Why died I not from the womb? Why did I not give up the ghost when I came out of the belly?" Job 3:11 KJV

"WHY?" How many times have circumstances provoked this question? Job lost all but his wife and his health was reduced to "sore boils from the sole of his foot unto his crown." The softest place to sit was "down among the ashes." His sorrow crushed him. In spite of every reason to do so, "Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly." His attitude remained "Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the LORD Gave, and the LORD Hath Taken Away; Blessed be the Name of the LORD." We could only hope to retain the faith of this upright man of whom God, Himself, asked Satan, "Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil? And still he holdeth fast his integrity, although thou movedst Me against him, to destroy him without cause." As if it wasn't enough that his children had all died and his possessions gone, Satan prompted his dear wife to say, "Dost thou still retain thine integrity? Curse God, and die." Job replied; "Thou speakest as one of the foolish women speaketh. What? Shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil? In all this did not Job sin with his lips." However, in his heart the question still raged, "WHY?" God may not always make the reasons of our suffering clear. Even Christ in bitterest agony pled with the Father, "Why hast Thou forsaken me?" When it appeared that God had forsaken Job, He had not. Job was unaware of God's mandate to Satan. "Behold, he is in thine hand; but save his life." God knew what even Job did not; that Job trusted God no matter what. Can the same be said of us? Would we curse God if presented with the same trial? None can honestly answer that.
