

"For the LORD shall be thy confidence, and shall keep thy foot from being taken. Withhold not good from them to whom it is due, when it is in the power of thine hand to do it." Proverbs 3:26-27 KJV

"Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and ALL these things shall be added unto you." If I lack, God is either testing my faith or I am seeking my own ends and not God's. God's riches will flow through us to others if we seek God's favor and not our pleasure. Joy will be our state of existence and peace will be our state of mind! Just as *"the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance,"* your beneficence may be the cord that draws a soul to God or supplies a request of a faithful saint. We need not know the reason for our bounty, but we should be ever ready to allow it to flow to another. *"If a brother or sister be naked, and destitute of daily food, And one of you say unto them, Depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled; notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body; what doth it profit?"* Trust Father's promise to *"supply all your need according to His riches."* Even though we may see no possible avenue of resupply, if necessary, God can create our supply within our own cruse of oil and barrel of meal. Do we so soon forget the widows of Elijah's day? One, not only gave her last morsel away, but prepared it for another whilst her own belly growled with hunger. Another poured away all her debts from her own cruse of oil. By these acts alone we know them to be Godly women. Obedience to God in the face of their own wants manifested faith and trust in God. While others may see us as needy, we rest securely in God's promise. *"I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread."* Your gift may be the bridge between heaven and hell for some poor lost soul. You may not have much, but your willingness to give lets *"your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in heaven."* One of the earmarks of the righteous is; *"He is ever merciful, and lendeth; and his seed is blessed."* Jesus put it another way for His Church; *"By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another."* If you don't need it right now, it is probably for another. Father knows your need *"before you ask."*
