


God's Word will do most of the writing today. God always says it best. As always, the Scripture is italicized.

*"This second epistle, beloved, I now write unto you; in both which I stir up your pure minds by way of remembrance: That ye may be mindful of the Words which were spoken before by the Holy prophets, and of the commandment of us the apostles of the Lord and Saviour: Knowing this first, that there shall come in the Last Days scoffers, walking after their own lusts, and saying, 'Where is the promise of His Coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the Creation.'"*



Certain sects say that the Lord has already come and that there is no rapture or catching away of the saints. They even wrest the Scripture to try and convince others. God's Word is plain spoken. Judgment will come again.

*"For this they willingly are ignorant of, that by the Word of God the heavens were of old, and the earth standing out of the water and in the water: Whereby the world that then was, being overflowed with water, perished: But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same Word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the Day of Judgment and perdition of ungodly men."*

God's Word wasn't believed then and it's not believed now. The Word of God is being rejected by even so-called believers, but it makes no difference. God's Plan has never faltered and never will.

*"But, Beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slack concerning His Promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance."*

God is not going to tarry one second past His appointed deadline. Men are bound by time and cannot comprehend the realm of eternity. We even measure eternity with time by using words like forever, eternal, and etc. God is not subject to time. He created time for our benefit. He exists beyond its boundaries.

*"But the Day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up. Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness, looking for and hasting unto the coming of the Day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat? Nevertheless we, according to His Promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness."*

No one will expect His coming except those who are waiting for the heralded Bridegroom. They will be ready at His arrival. They will not be caught off guard or unprepared. The midnight hour approaches.

*"Wherefore, Beloved, seeing that ye look for such things, be diligent that ye may be found of Him in Peace, without spot, and blameless. And account that the longsuffering of our Lord is Salvation; even as our beloved brother Paul also according to the wisdom given unto him hath written unto you; As also in all his epistles, speaking in them of these things; in which are some things hard to be understood, which they that are unlearned and unstable wrest, as they do also the other scriptures, unto their own destruction."*

Rebellious unbelievers seek to change the Truth of Scripture by applying human reason to the plain language of the Written Word. They are willingly ignorant of the peril in which they place themselves and their followers. Do you believe? Your obedience is the proof! The Apostle's closing argument is timeless Truth.

*"Ye therefore, Beloved, seeing ye know these things before, beware lest ye also, being led away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own stedfastness.
