They are clothed with simple majesty that transcends the realm of the physical and transports us into the Divine. They evoke an emotional response from every glance by simply being what they are. God's providential care for us is by far more meticulous than His care for the grasses "of the field." We worry about the details for which He has already made provision. We can trust Him to save our eternal souls from fire and eternal death, yet, somehow in our twisted logic we find Him unable to handle simple daily affairs. David said he had never seen "*the righteous forsaken nor his seed begging bread.*" Our problem is we get caught up in worldly philosophies and start trying to amass wealth; like kids on a beach hoarding sand. Why? Father owns everything. Every little bit and speck belongs to Him. If we walk in the Spirit, that is, the path of faithful trusting obedience to God's Word, provision lines our path. God's Commands are His Blessings, not the things He provides. If we walk any other path than obedience to His Word, we must provide for ourselves. Jesus explains it: "*Seek ye first the Kingdom of God, and His Righteousness; and ALL these things shall be added unto you.*" Tired of doing it yourself? Obey God and see what happens! God says, "*Prove Me!*" In other words, "*Trust Me!*" Have you?

God's rain falls on the just and the unjust. If you have it, it is because God gave it to you. If you don't, it's because you don't need it or you're doing things your own way. "*He that spared not His Own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?*" If God died for our sakes, what makes us think that He doesn't care about the little details of our lives?
