"And Jesus called <u>a little child</u> unto him, and set him in the midst of them, And said, 'Verily I say unto you, Except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, the same is greatest in the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 18:2-4 KJV

If you tell a child you are going to give them a cookie, they will pester you till you do. They anticipate the fruition of your promise. They, in fact, expect it! God honors simple unquestioning faith. We often complicate faith with the if's, and's, and but's of doubt which are actually unbelief! Worry is unbelief. Most of God's promises are conditional upon your obedience. The Truth is, you either trust God or not! "Faith is the...evidence of things NOT SEEN!" Complicating faith with a plethora of add-ons is actually a lack of it. Faith needs no admixture of anything. "Faith cometh by...the Word of God...and



that, not of yourself, it is the gift of God." Some say you have to "prove" your faith. No, you have to "have" faith. A believer's obedience to God's Word verifies they possess it; disobedience proves you don't. "Without faith, it is impossible to please...God." Jesus, the "Word made flesh," said, "My sheep hear (believe and obey) my voice and they follow me.' Hereby we do know that we know Him, if we keep (obey) His commandments." Obeying God's Word in spite of circumstance is the epitome of faith. God said it and that settles it! It doesn't matter what I do. The fearful will be cast into the lake of fire. If anxiety overrides your faith, then you sink into unbelief. All, "What if's," are straight from the pit of hell! They reiterate the first Satanic question, "Hast God said?" Tithing is about more than money. God expects, at the least, a tenth of everything, time, goods, and increase, and wise stewardship of the rest.
