"And daily in the temple, and in every house, they <u>ceased not to teach</u> and preach Jesus Christ." Acts 5:42 KJV

Many times I have heard, "I would teach if I could, but I can't." This is an admission of disobedience. "Study to shew thyself approved unto God; a workman that needeth not to be ashamed. And in this Law shalt thou meditate day and night. Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness." Saying you can't teach is admitting you don't know anything about God's Word. The question is then begged, "Why not?" Were you not commanded in the Holy Writ to study, meditate, and seek? You have an inexhaustible supply of the precious things of God and you refuse to learn and share that which was so
