"But my <u>God Shall Supply All Your NEED</u> according to His Riches in Glory by Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:19no2 KJV

What do we truly NEED? We often want what we do not need. Think hard about what it is you must have today to stay alive and provide for your loved ones. Go to Father and ask Him to supply your NEEDS. "With God nothing is impossible." When Christ instructed us to pray, "Give us, this day, our DAILY bread (today's NEED)." You'll miss something now, if you fret about tomorrow, be it good or evil. "Ye know not what shall be on the morrow." Then trust His Decision and Provision. The caveat is we must remain cheerfully obedient, because that is the only Path



where God's Provision is found. "Seek ye FIRST THE Kingdom of God and His Righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you." Do we begin our day requesting our "daily needs" from Father? We are prone to begin and continue without Him until something obstructs or hinders us. We do not depend on Father at all, but have reduced Him to assistant and warehouse; and attempt to drag Him around with us during OUR day like a good luck talisman. "This is the day that the Lord hath Made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." We spend our days fretting about the future and neglecting Father! "Take no thought, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or, 'What shall we drink?' or, 'Wherewithal shall we be clothed?' Your Heavenly Father Knoweth that ye have need of all these things. For that ye ought to say, 'If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that." You say, "But I must provide for my family!" If you have it, provide it; if you don't request it from Father, thereby teaching your family to Whom, for what, and how to pray. Fret and worry manifest our lack of faith. Jesus Said, "If ye love Me, keep My Commandments. If ye know these things, happy are ye, if ye do them.' And hereby we do know that we know Him, if we keep His Commandments. Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the Work of the Lord." Like the words of the old hymn tell us: "There's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."

If I would trust my Father's Love, My needs are met from up Above, And I will find my self content, Obeying God with all intent. –CGP

The very planning to go to do this or that is sin unless we say, "If the Lord will." My Dad used to always say, "Lord willing, we'll do this and that," and I'm just now, (past 50) getting it. Does God not hold our very breath in His hands? Did you give Him thanks for that, today? Did you thank Him last night for the Provision of yesterday, or did you lie in bed fretting over lack or tomorrow? Thankfulness is the earmark of God's Children. Doubt will blind you to Truth. "Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, NEITHER WERE THANKFUL; but became vain (self-centered) in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened." We are so used to omitting God, we seldom include Him. We seldom think of our lack as a result of sin or perhaps a lesson from Father, so ask God to reveal your true needs. Sometimes Father says, "No," but whatever it is you truly need, Father knows it and you need but trust, ask, and wait.

"Abide in Me (the Word), and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in Me. I AM the Vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in Me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for WITHOUT ME YE CAN DO NOTHING." John 15:4-5 KJV
